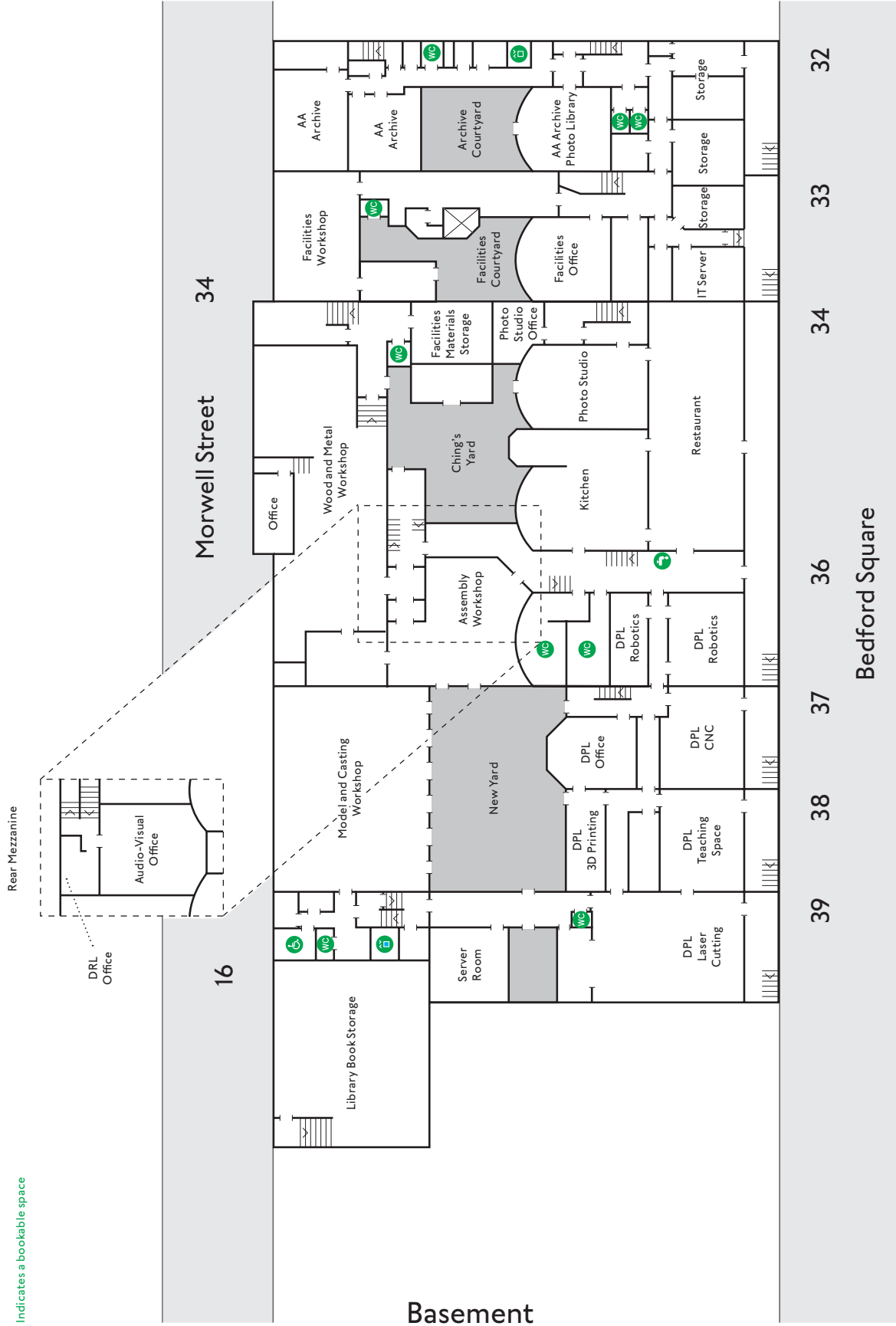
The plans shown in this guide provide a map of how to navigate from space to space and floor to floor.

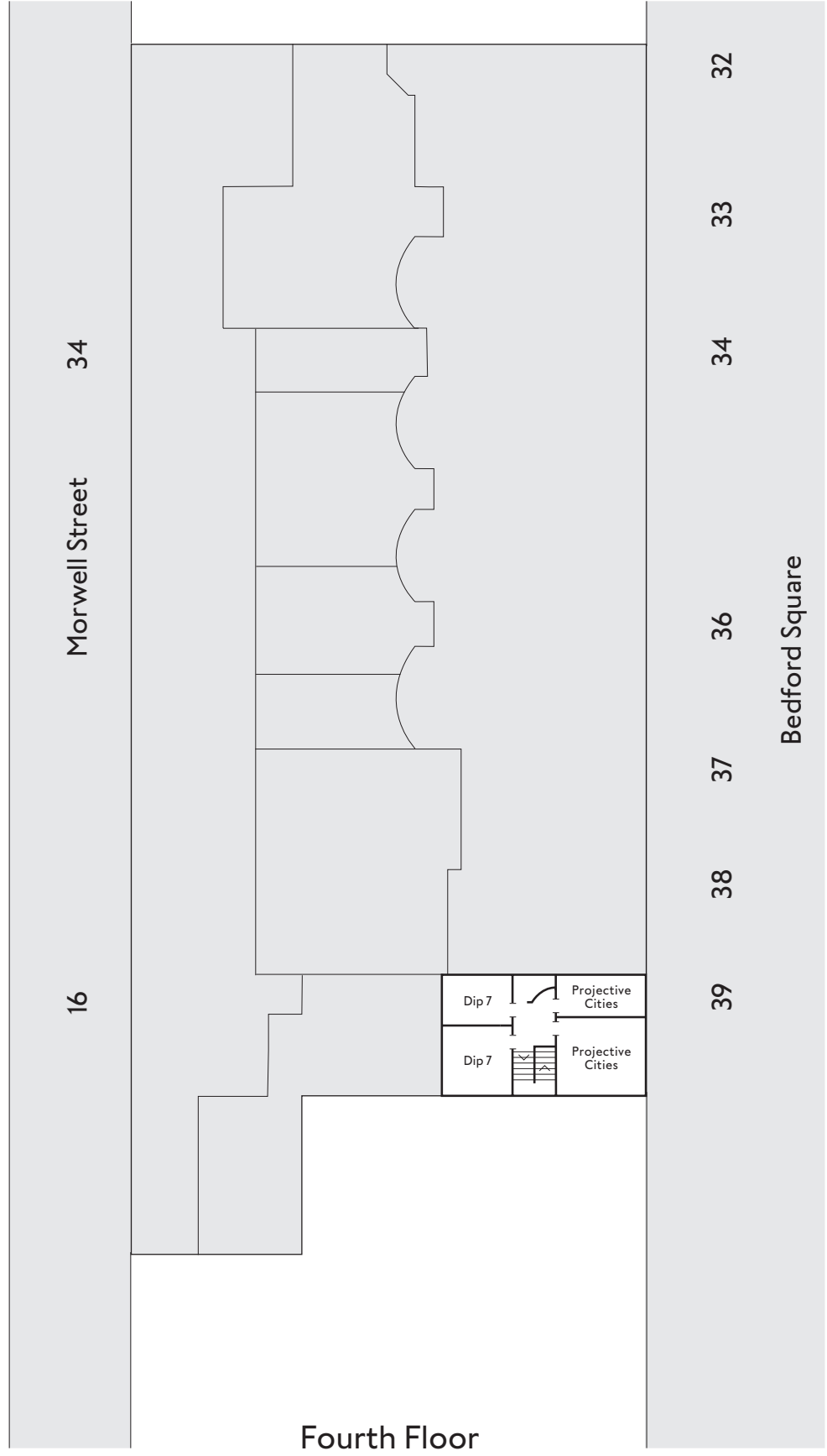
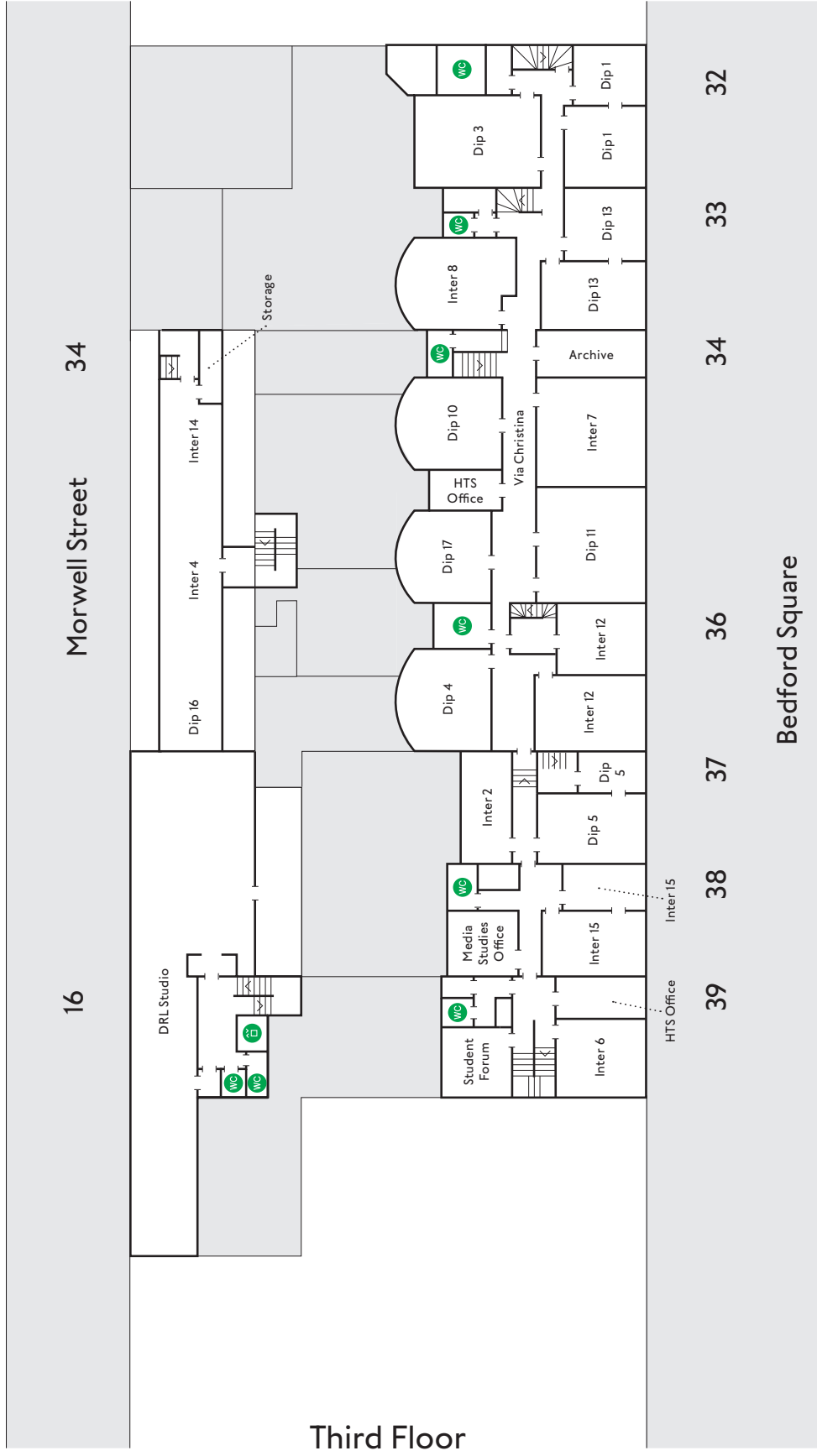


First Floor

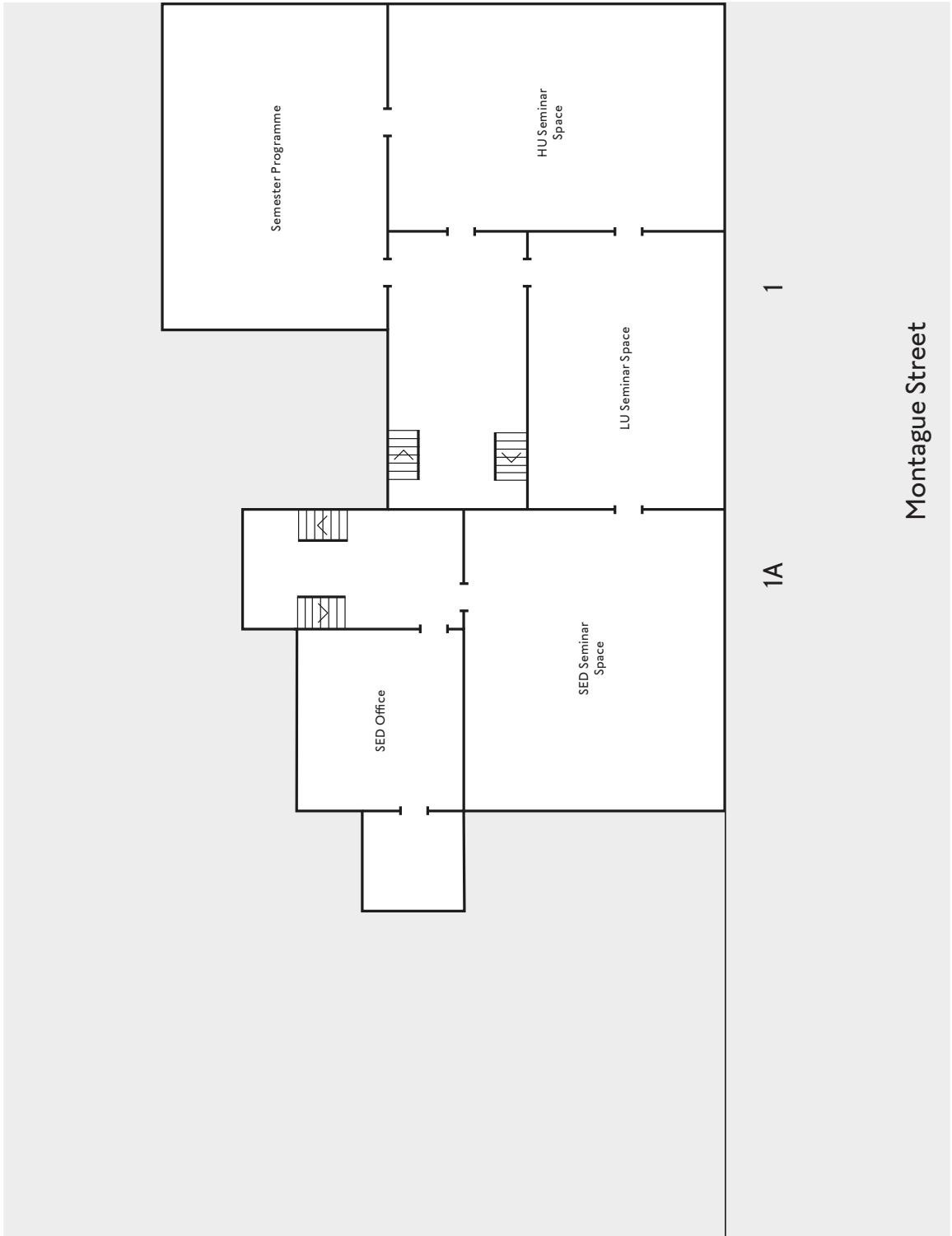

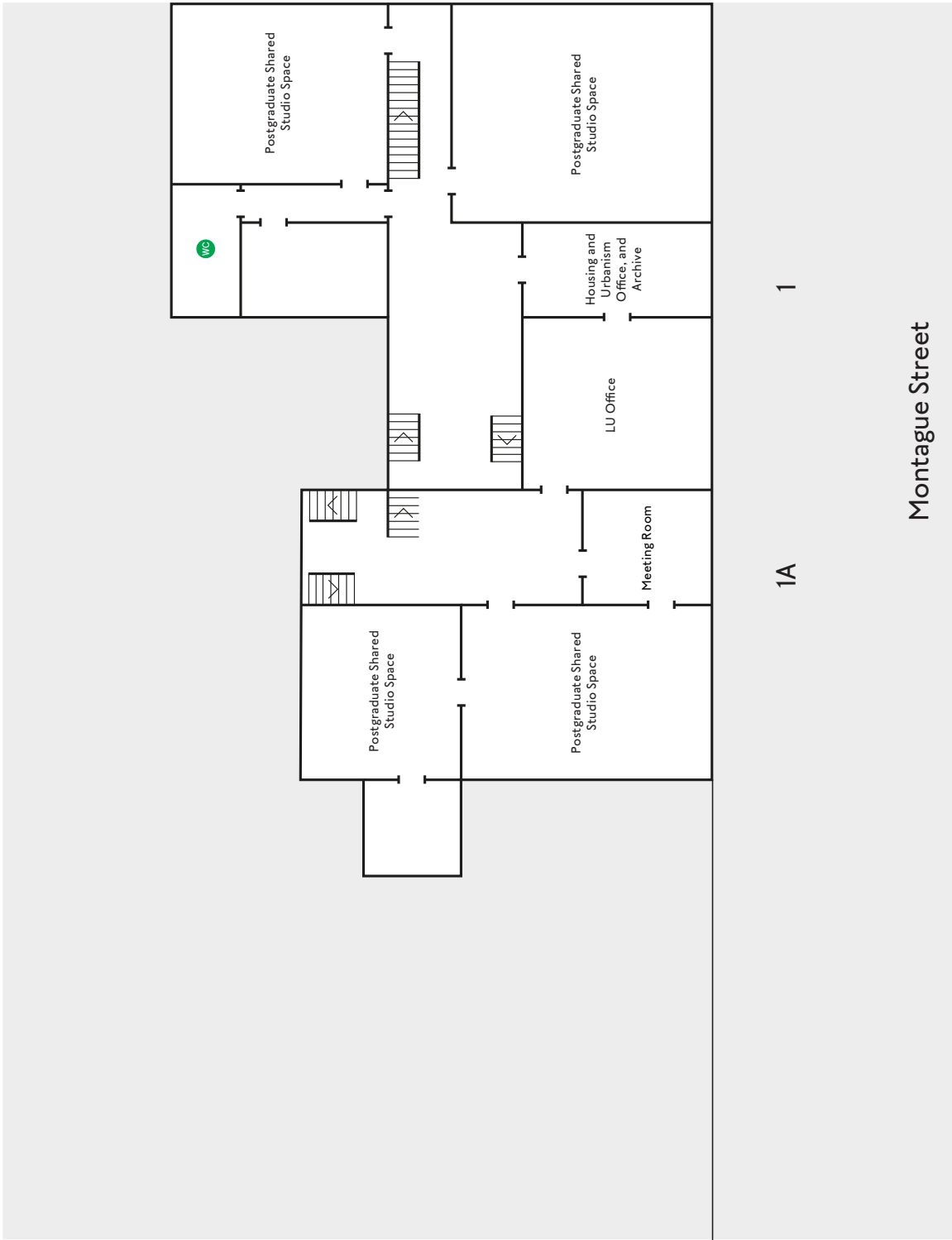

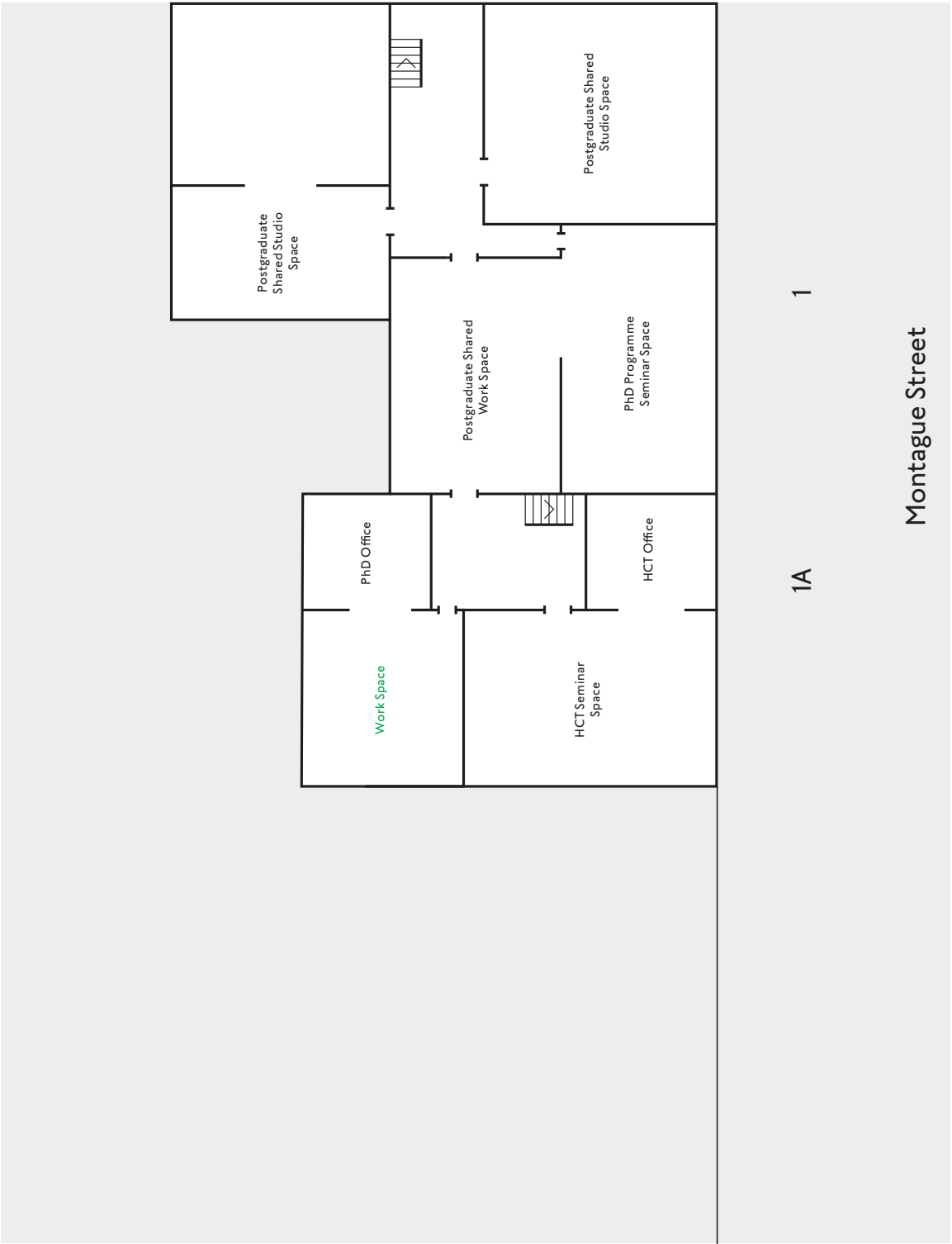

Hooke Park

Hooke Park is a 150-hectare working forest that is owned and operated by the school, and contains a growing educational facility for design, workshop, construction and landscape-focused activities. Located in the county of Dorset, England, it has been designated an Ancient Woodland and forms part of the Dorset Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The woodland is a mixture of broadleaved and conifer species that provide the prime source of timber for students' construction activities. The campus is home to the AA's Design and Make Taught Postgraduate programme and hosts many of the school's units and programmes throughout the year.

The plans in this guide provide a localised map for these campus buildings, but we encourage all who visit to venture beyond this immediate vicinity and feel free to explore the forest.



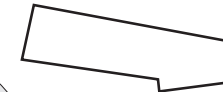

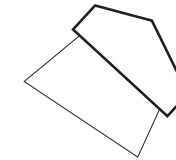

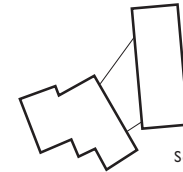
